Success journey at St. benedict community Centre starts at this large dumpsite in Dandora where all the wastes in Nairobi end up. Children who are orphans and from extremely poor families find themselves here looking for every means to survive. It has never been their choice to be at the dumpsite, not their choice to eat rotting leftovers not even their choice to miss school but because they need to survive, they find themselves here. Looking at the dumpsite any concerned person wonders for how long can a child survive here before contracting a disease? What happens to them at night? How can they get out of this situation and end inter-generational poverty in their lives? Where will the society get professionals if we ignore these children? These are the very concerns that compel me to do a regular visit at the dumpsite on my rescue mission.

Getting a child out of this dumpsite to settle in a class at St. Benedict Community Centre, get meals, education, talent be nurtured and draw him or her closer to God is always the **FIRST SUCCESS**.

This year we had 12 children who sat for their national examinations in grade8, results are out and the Centre is on a celebratory mood because they have impressive results.

It has been a journey of great commitment from both our staff and the learners themselves who believe in **Nelson Mandela's** Quote "Education is the most powerful weapon you can use to change the world".

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UNLOCKING OPPORTUNITIES FOR CHILDREN

FEBRUARY 2024 UPDATE.



At St. Benedict Community Centre we strive to provide humanitarian assistance and education to children who despite not being their choice find themselves struggling to survive. We believe that each and every child should access quality education regardless of the economic background.

Upon completion of primary education at our Centre we always lobby for support so that they can proceed to secondary schools. In last year's exams children did not disappoint and their hard work rewarded them best secondary schools. We can now happily report that out of 12 candidates who completed primary education (Grde8), 10 have joined and are now in secondary schools. This is a transition rate of 83.3%. The two have not joined because of

financial constraints. This also marked the end of **8.4.4** system of curriculum in Primary schools, we are now fully implementing Competency based curriculum C.B.C

Another category of children who have transitioned to Junior Secondary School are ⁹ learners who were in grade six and did their Kenya Primary School Education Assessment (KEPSEA). Junior Secondary schools are domiciled in primary schools as per the ministry of education requirement but due to limited resources we could not have the Junior Secondary School Section and therefore collaborated with neighboring primary schools for placement of our learners. All joined making it a transition rate of 100%.

The quality contents and new learning methodology introduced to us by Wilearn 4 Life gave our children competitive advantage and unlocked opportunities for them.

CURRENT SCHOOL POPULATION

The school is now having children from pre-primary 1 to Grade 6. The current school population per class is as follows: -

School population last year was 160. Out of this number we had 12 grade eight and 9 grade six. This year we have new enrolment of 48 children distributed across the classes with beginners pp1 being the majority. Growth rate of 30% and for the first time in the history of the school we recorded retention rate of 100%.

RELOCATION PROGRESS

As it stands now the purchased piece of land now belongs to St. Benedict Community Centre as shown on the document attached with this update and therefore adds to the list of accomplishments as far as relocation is concerned. The following are the accomplishments made so far: -

- ✓ Full payment of the land.
- ✓ Architectural design, structural design and bill of quantities done.
- ✓ Lawyers legal fee paid.
- ✓ Payment for design cost made.
- ✓ Ownership transfer effected from the seller to ST. BENEDICT COMMUNITY CENTRE.

With the transfer now effected the construction designs can be taken for approval before the commencement of construction work.
