




St. Benedict Community Centre is a community based organization registered in Kenya by Ministry of Education and Gender and Social Services to support needy families within Dandora, Njiru District.

St. Benedict Community Centre offers primary education, Feeding program, spiritual nourishment and talent nurturing to less privileged children in Dandora some of who are rehabilitated from the dumpsite.

The Centre was founded by Diana Jomo in 2008. The Centre's catchment has a population whose income is below one dollar a day and hardly meets family needs.

Since then the Centre has intercepted to ensure that innocent and needy children from humble backgrounds access education and nutrition just like any other child in the republic of Kenya. The Centre has created job opportunities for the members of the society both directly and indirectly. Meals are provided in the Centre through the help of well-wishers.

The center serves children from Dandora and its environs. The selection criteria are as follows:

- 1. Referral by local authority.
- 2. Admission through routine check at the dumpsite.
- 3. Selection of children by school's education committee.
- 4. Admission request made by parents or guardians.
- 5. Referral by religious leaders.

SUBJECTS OFFERED

Children are taught the following subjects within the curriculum of primary education in Kenya;

8-4-4 **SYSTEM**

Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Christian Religious Education, Kiswahili and English.

NEW CURRICULUM C.B.C.

English Language Activities, Kiswahili Lugha Activities, Mathematics Activities, Environment Activities, Art and craft, Music, Hygiene and Nutrition Activities, Movement Activities and Christian Religious Education. Home science, Agriculture, Science and Technology, Physical Education.

School days starts from Monday to Friday School programs start at 7.00 am to 5:30 pm The centres feeding program runs throughout, both for school days, weekends and school holidays.
